Interview: Mrs. David

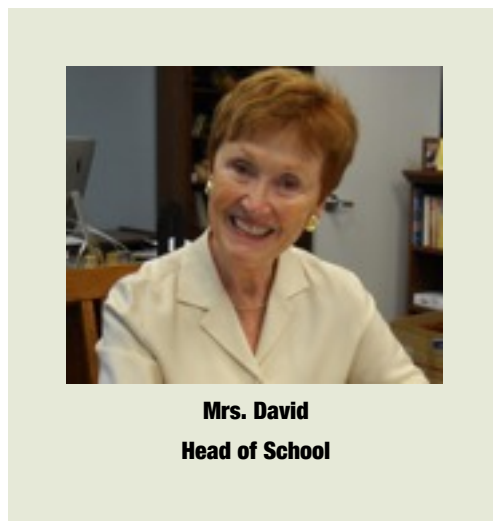
We sat down with Mrs. David on Thursday, September 29th to ask her a few questions in order to get to know her better.

What was the funniest thing that has happened since you arrived at St. James'?

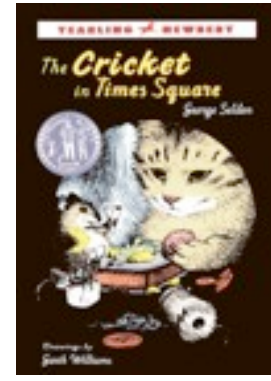
